

Represented biotech firm **Sorrento Therapeutics** as plaintiff in multiple litigations alleging a high profile business partner's scheme to "catch and kill" Sorrento's promising cancer drug, Cynviloq.

Secured a victory for **BlackBerry Corp.** and **BlackBerry Ltd.** in civil extortion and unfair competition claims leveled against it by MobileIron, forcing it to pay Blackberry's legal fees and drop its lawsuit.

Obtained favorable settlement for a **leading fitness technology company** – including admissions of patent validity, intentional copying and an agreement to immediately cease using its patented leaderboard technology – after prevailing on an *Alice* challenge and virtually every other motion.
